The Mary Potter nurses, and allied team helped get his pain under control which gave him more time to do what he loved. Thanks to you he got to spend time with his friends, drink good wine and listen to his favourite music. It also gave him a chance to get his affairs in order.

When Joff's brother offered to bring his favourite singer to the Hospice to perform one last time, staff suggested that the Foundation could organise a mini concert for family & friends. A 'Day on the Green' type event was born. The event planning process brought Joff a renewed sense of purpose and meaning.

It was a joyous occasion for all!

Each afternoon, Joff and his brother would sit on the wall in front of the Hospice, sharing a glass of wine. *Life is too short to drink bad wine* was Joff's motto. Penfolds Bin 389 was his wine of choice, and they enjoyed every drop!

After receiving a gift of a Hank Williams LP, we bought Joff a vintage-style record player. This surprise gift transported him right back to his younger years. Thank you for supporting us in recreating the sounds of his youth and helping Joff relive happy memories.

Joff became an advocate for Mary Potter Hospice and Calvary's Palliative Home Care Service. To say thank you and to help spread the word about the care he experienced, Joff made a video with us.

Calvary Caring Hearts Grief Support Group – Seeds of hope in healing, thanks to you



Led by Social Worker Sig, the grief group offers a space for recently bereaved individuals to come together and support one another.

Through sharing stories and practical tips, participants wgain skills and create bonds with others who know what they are going through. Topics covered so far include stages of grief, secondary losses, continuing bonds, and tips for self-care. There is also a free library (pictured right) kindly established by The Walker Private Fund. Participants are encouraged to borrow resources, for as long as they wish.

As well as expanding their knowledge on ways to manage their grief, it has been heartening to witness the blossoming friendships. No-one can take away the pain of losing a loved one, but with each session, some participants are already growing in confidence.

One participant shared "I am not sure if I will need to come back again — I already feel like the first three sessions have been so helpful to me".
