# Reflecting on a year of incredible support, achievements and milestones



Dear Members and Supporters,

On behalf of the Board of The Mary Potter Foundation, it is my privilege to present our 2023/24 report, and share just a few of the outstanding achievements that our donors' generosity has made possible.

When I reflect on the care and improvements to programs and facilities that have been delivered over the past year, I am truly grateful to those who have supported the Foundation so generously.

*We could do nothing without our extraordinary donors, and I extend my heartfelt thanks to you for the difference you make to patients and families facing the hardest time in their lives.*

The Board is delighted to announce the completion of refurbishments to all 15 patient rooms in the Hospice, now bringing the accommodation to a standard that reflects the first-class care that every patient and family deserve. This project has taken three years in total, with the final stage being completed in December 2023. Logistically, this was a project that had to be acutely sensitive to the needs of patients and Hospice staff; to accomplish this, rooms were taken offline in stages, with as little disruption to the Hospice as possible. The feedback about the

refurbishment has been unanimously positive. The rooms all look fantastic, and the nurses have told the Foundation team how lovely it is to now bring their patients into such light, modern & welcoming accommodation. I am incredibly grateful to every single donor who has contributed to this project. You should be very proud of what you've made possible. The impact of your generosity will be felt by Hospice patients and their families for years to come.

Bequests continue to play a vital role in meeting funding commitments so that patients and families can receive the best possible care. I would like to acknowledge the generosity of nine special people who made the decision to leave a bequest to the Foundation last year. We are indebted to them in supporting us in this way. They have left an extraordinary legacy, ensuring exceptional patient care continues beyond their own lifetime.

Over the past year, the Board has invested more in the support of Palliative Care in the home, with our donors making it possible to bring Pastoral Care and the Fra Angelico Art program into patients' homes. This initiative is showing great outcomes already, as it serves patients and their families with spiritual & emotional support, comfort and reassurance, while also giving them an opportunity to create meaningful and personal pieces of art that they can leave to their family.

In December, the Loving Tree Carols Concert took place in St Francis Xavier's Cathedral. Thank you to the Archbishop for allowing us to hold our Christmas event in such a stunning location. 900 donors and family members came together that night to give thanks for their loved ones at Christmas. As always, the music was beautiful, and we could feel how much it meant to everyone who attended.

*I do want to extend the Board's deepest thanks and gratitude to SA Power Networks who sponsor the Carols Concert and Lighting of the Loving Tree event every year.*

For 25 years they have generously supported The Mary Potter Foundation – an amazing run, and a relationship we deeply appreciate. You can read more about how SA Power Networks have supported the Foundation on Page 7.

Our Walk for Love event in May this year resulted in the highest number of participants ever, with over 1,100 people registered to walk. The event made a return to Carclew for the first time in six years – it was a fantastic venue and a very successful day. We know what a special event this is and how much it means to people who walk to remember their loved ones. We couldn't be more grateful for their support, and their combined fundraising amounted to \$150,000 – an incredible result!

# Financial Overview



I am pleased to report that during FY24, the Foundation invested \$1,847,927 into care, facilities, staffing and programs in Mary Potter Hospice, Calvary Palliative Home Care Service, St Helen's ward, Calvary Central Districts, Calvary Adelaide, Calvary Aged Care and the Cancer Centres located in Kimberley House, North Adelaide and in the Connery Centre, Playford.

In December 2023, the Board announced the completion of the refurbishment of 15 patient rooms and bathrooms in Mary Potter Hospice. This project started before COVID. Access issues contributed to the delays; however, the result was worth the wait.

Our net operating surplus for the year was \$46,242 after transferring \$400,000 to our Corpus Reserve. The Board is committed to raising the funds we need to meet current needs, whilst growing our Corpus from bequests, to meet future needs as demand for palliative care increases.

# SA Power Networks – Empowering Patient Care for 25 years

As the sole sponsor of the Lighting of the Loving Tree since 1999, SA Power Networks has been behind every event. They have assisted in so many ways, including checking the lights on the tree, loaning us their cherry picker to repair and replace lights, and by covering all costs for the Carols Concert.

Thanks to their generosity, the Foundation can apply all donations received at Christmas, to patient care, rather than event costs.

The Carols Concert is a special event. At Christmas, families, friends, staff and volunteers come together to remember loved ones and give thanks for the care they received.

The Lighting of the Loving Tree is not the only SA Power Networks' initiative. They often sponsor our Golf Day, and many staff have volunteered to help Mary Potter Hospice over the years.

In addition, back in 2019, SA Power Networks donated a transformational gift after one of their staff died in Mary Potter Hospice. We were able to make much-needed upgrades to one room and purchase six ceiling hoists, which ensured every room had a hoist. This gift was the catalyst for the refurbishment of all 15 patient rooms; a project we completed in December 2023.

We have been honoured to partner with SA Power Networks and receive incredible support, but our greatest honour has been to care for their staff, family and friends when the need has arisen.

# Mary Potter Hospice



Mary Potter Hospice provided exceptional care for over 300 patients in 2023/2024. We give thanks for the care, programs and services that donors made possible.

## Stage 4 of the Hospice Refurbishment project complete

All 15 patient rooms in the Hospice were freshly refurbished by December 2023, bringing us closer to our vision of a modern and welcome facility for patients, families, visitor and staff.

## Dedicated Staff Member in the Hospice

Our Patient & Family Support Coordinator started her role in the Hospice this financial year. She pours her heart into making sure the final days of a patient (and their family) is the best it can possibly be. Having that responsiveness when time is very limited, ensures that each patient receives Welcome flowers, a beautiful quilt and a Welcome Box when they arrive – and with the coordinator checking in with the patient and family every day, she can ensure that any individual requests during the patient's stay are taken care of promptly. That might mean organising activities that bring families together, or just a final request for something as simple as an Iced Coffee. There have been wonderful outcomes from this dedicated role.





## Nurse Educator

The Board considers the role of Nurse Educator as hugely important for incoming Hospice nurses to be shown the special 'Mary Potter way'. Mary Potter Hospice has a reputation for excellence in palliative and end-of-life care. The Nurse Educator ensures this reputation continues. An experienced Hospice nurse works shoulder-to-shoulder with new nurses, developing their knowledge, expertise and communication skills.



## Family Kitchen

The Family Kitchen remains the heart of the Hospice. It is crucial to the care of patients' families and visitors. Its central location in the middle of the Hospice means that family members aren't far away from their loved one's room when they want to get a snack, sandwich or coffee – day or night.

The warm and well-stocked kitchen helps our families feel cared for and nurtured whenever they want a break.

## Programs

One of our most-loved programs is Pet Therapy. The paw-some team now make weekly visits to the Hospice to brighten everyone's day. A visit from a furry friend can help melt away some of the stress and anxiety that patients and their families may experience.

With the average length of stay in the Hospice now seven days, this program doubled visits in 2023/2024 so that no patient missed out on this program.



*Thanks to the generosity of donors, in 2023/2024 the Foundation was able to increase support beyond Mary Potter Hospice – to give access to more of our programs and services for palliative patients and residents in the Home Care Service, Calvary Central Districts Hospital, Calvary Aged Care and in the cancer centres at North Adelaide and at Playford.*

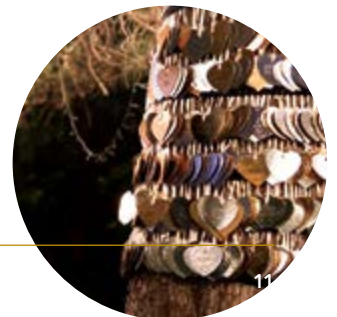

- ~ The program has expanded in recent years, to include patients and residents at Calvary Central Districts Hospital, Calvary Adelaide Hospital and in Calvary Aged Care.
- ~ We are so grateful to every one of the talented quilters and quilting groups who have been part of this program, and for the profound impact their beautiful quilts have had on patients and their families.
